Taking the First Step

For several years, I have been reading the <u>Nerd Fitness</u> blog and newsletter. Being a techie, I was intrigued by the title. The premise is that the author, Steve Kamb, decided to treat his life as a video game with levels and achievements to unlock. I'm not a gamer, but I'm always looking for something

quirky to help me reach my goals. Even though there is an emphasis on diet and exercise, the advice has encouraged me to check a few more things off my "bucket list".

Steve is now a bestselling author and has tens of thousands of members in his Fitness Academy.
